Abstract

Quedlinburg is one of the best-preserved medieval towns in Germany. The quaint town with its ornate half-timbered houses has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1994. This short clip produced by *Deutsche Welle* explores the streets of Quedlinburg during the Christmas season, showcases the famous Christmas market, and introduces the viewer to a special kind of advent calendar only practiced in Quedlinburg.
