

Results of the Volkskammer Election (March 18, 1990)

Abstract

The *Volkskammer* election returns revealed overwhelming support for unification and a clear majority for a rapid monetary union. The "Alliance for Germany," led by the CDU, won a surprising victory, particularly in the south and among workers.
