


A Crematorium (c. 1875)

Abstract

Religious conservatives opposed the new practice of cremation, but this depiction of a crematorium designed by the Siemens firm suggests that traditional religious ritual was not incompatible with the introduction of a new technology—particularly one endorsed by a professor. That the ultimate fate of the corpse is completely hidden from view was also a balm to bourgeois sensibilities.
