

“The Socialist Jack-in-the-Box” (September 28, 1878)

Abstract

Despite his military outfit and strenuous exertions, Bismarck is unable to wrestle the bogey-man of socialism back into the box. This cartoon from the British satirical magazine *Punch* appeared at a time when debate on the Anti-Socialist Law was still occupying the attention of the Reichstag deputies in Berlin.
