

## Beatings for Marital Bliss (2nd Half of the 17th Century)

## Abstract

The rapidly growing literature on the conditions of a happy marriage and on codes of behavior reinforced gender roles. In the first scene of this two-part woodcut, a man beats his wife for being proud, impious, lazy, and drunk; in the second scene, a woman beats her husband for gambling, drinking, gluttony, and chasing pretty girls.
