Seventeenth-Century Student Song: *Maidens Care only about Appearances* (mid-17th century)

Abstract

Since the Middle Ages, students cultivated their own musical traditions, and in the seventeenth century, several printed collections of student songs appeared in the German-speaking world. The city of Leipzig in Saxony was both the site of a prestigious university and a center of musical creativity in Germany. The Saxon composer and church musician Adam Krieger (1634-1666) served as organist at the Nikolaikirche in Leipzig from 1655. There, he founded a *collegium musicum* in the city, a private association of music lovers that also included numerous students. The *collegium* financed itself through concerts for wealthy families of the nobility and bourgeoisie, and the song heard here was part of the repertoire of the student ensemble.
