

## **AEG Production in Berlin (c. 1900)**

## **Abstract**

Industrial production exploited economies of scale and rational organization. In this workshop-like factory of AEG [Allgemeine Elektizitäts-Gesellschaft or the General Electric Company], workers in industrial uniforms assembled small motors at benches lit by small lamps. A number of women were also involved in production; they can be seen on the left side of the photograph.
