

Hugo Krayn, Metropolis (Berlin) (1914)

Abstract

Hugo Krayn (1885-1919) was a painter and graphic artist who joined the Berlin Secession in 1915. His works mostly depict Berlin's industrial areas, its working class and its poor. His painting *Metropolis* thus depicts the darker side of Berlin: billowing smoke, factories, and hurrying workers reflect the impersonal forces of modernity.
